

Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord. Over the past year and more we have been mainly unable to share a meal with our families and friends and I am sure this is something we have missed. Each of us will have our own memories of sharing meals around the table. Many of these will be happy experiences of celebration and laughter, of love received and shared. Some memories may be sad, times when we were more aware of one who was absent than of those who were present.

Jesus shared table many times with his disciples. It is likely that, when sharing food with his disciples, he also shared with them his vision of God's kingdom. At table, the disciples imbibed something of Jesus' mind and heart and spirit. Of all the meals he shared with them, the meal that stayed in their memory more than any other was their last meal together. Today's gospel gives us Mark's account, his word-picture, of that last supper. This last meal Jesus shared with his disciples stood out in their memory, capturing the imagination of generations of disciples right up to ourselves.

He did more than share his vision with the disciples; he gave them himself in a way he had never done before, and in a way that anticipated the death he would die for them and for all. In giving himself in the form of the bread and wine of the meal, he was declaring himself to be their food and drink. In calling on them to take and eat, to take and drink, he was asking them to take their stand with him, to give themselves to him as he was giving himself to them. Jesus continues to give himself as food and drink to his followers.

Whenever we come to Mass and receive the Eucharist, we acknowledge Jesus as our bread of life, as the one who alone can satisfy our deepest hungers. That we will try and follow in his way and be faithful to him in our lives. Every time we gather for the Eucharist, we find ourselves once more in that upper room with the first disciples.

Live Streaming from St Felix Church


Currently our live streamed Masses on our Parish YouTube Channel are from my mobile phone. We did get a quote for a permanent system to be installed in our church, and now we need to fund-raise to enable this to happen. A permanent system would be more secure and provide better quality sound and pictures, and also could be available outside normal published Mass times, and at times when I am not in the parish. This will make sure all who are currently using our Live Streaming can continue to do so and others can make use of this important part of our parish mission.

To install this system we need to upgrade the current internet and broadband connection to the church. The cost of this plus installation will be in the region of £7000. Any donations to enable this to take place during the coming months are very welcome.

We have made a good start with donations so far amounting to £1366.49.

Important Note on Stewarding at Masses:

The Bishops Conference of England & Wales has said that we no longer have to have stewards at weekday Masses when numbers of people in church are small, especially now that people are familiar with the covid19 security requirements in their church. However people attending these Masses still need, at the moment, to continue to:

- Wear face coverings in church
- Sanitise hands on coming into and leaving church
- Provide 'track and trace' information
- Maintain the required social distance from others when finding a seat, going to receive Holy Communion and leaving church.
- Some volunteers from the congregation should sanitise the benches used after Mass.

Stewards are still required for Sunday Masses [Saturday evening and Sunday morning] and for other larger celebrations. If you are able to help with this ministry please speak to Fr John, Deacon Huw or Michael Bradshaw as soon as you can.
